Classes for Children

Toddlin' to Jesus (Church Nursery)

Mommies, Daddies, and babies are invited to gather for some much needed fellowship. We sing songs, have a toddler friendly devotion, eat a snack, and most importantly, talk about Christian parenting issues. It's a come as you are class, no strict schedule to follow, so don't worry if your little one is cranky (or if you are!) from a missed nap or a rough night.

Preschool 2 (P2 Room)
