The Zion Panthers competed with several other Dallas area schools on April 9 at Parish Episcopal. The varsity boys earned 59 points to win first place. They were led by Morgan Whiteman of White Rock, who finished first in the shot put and discus, and Logan O'Brien of White Rock, who finished first in the long jump, 100-meter dash and the 200-meter dash.

Points are awarded for finishing in the top eight of each event. Zion had several boys and girls contribute to their point totals, including another first place finish by the 4x200m relay team of Lakewood residents Kevin Jebaraj and Elias Lai, and White Rock residents Logan O'Brien and

Paul Scrimshire. A second place finish for the 4x200m relay team of Bryce Bilodeau of Rockwall, Alexander Hancock of North Dallas, Daniel Oddsson of Lake Highlands and Stefen Thompson of Lakewood. The Zion Lutheran varsity boys have earned first place this season in IAA soccer and basketball as well.

"This has been an amazing year of athletic competition for the Zion Panthers," said Darcy Madsen, varsity track coach and athletic director. "As their coach, I couldn't be more proud. As their athletic director, I couldn't have asked for a better group of athletes to represent our school in athletic competition.
